

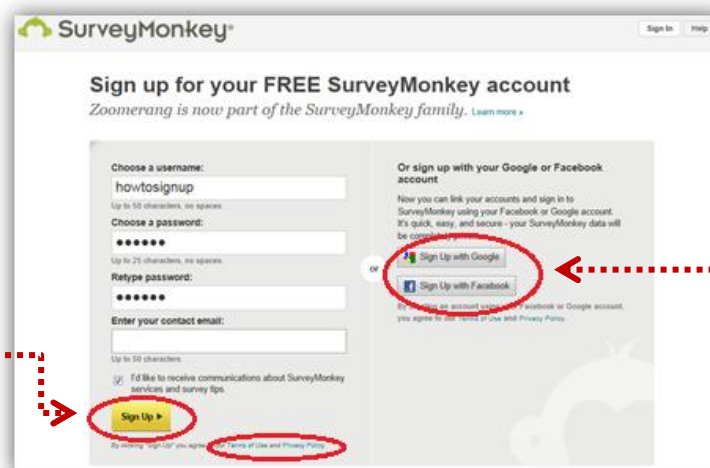
How To Create A SurveyMonkey Account

1. Go to www.surveymonkey.com
2. You will be sent to SurveyMonkey's home page that will appear as below:



Click on "Sign Up FREE"

3. You will be taken to the sign up page that gives you 3 options:



When You have entered your details, click on "Sign Up"

Here you are given the option to create your SurveyMonkey account using an existing Google or Facebook account.

Please also read the "Terms of Use" and "Privacy Policy" before signing up.

This page requires you to either:

- Choose a username, password and enter your email address. If the username you choose is already being used, you will be informed immediately and you will need to try another name.
- Sign up using an existing Google account. If you choose this option you will need to sign into your Google account (this may not be required if you have already logged onto your Google account, or you may be asked to choose between Google accounts if you have more than one). You will also need to allow SurveyMonkey to access a few details you used when you signed up to Google.
- Sign up using an existing Facebook account. If you would like to sign up to SurveyMonkey using Facebook you will be required sign into Facebook then allow (SurveyMonkey) access to some of your details. Please note that this likely to result in SurveyMonkey posting things on your Facebook wall.

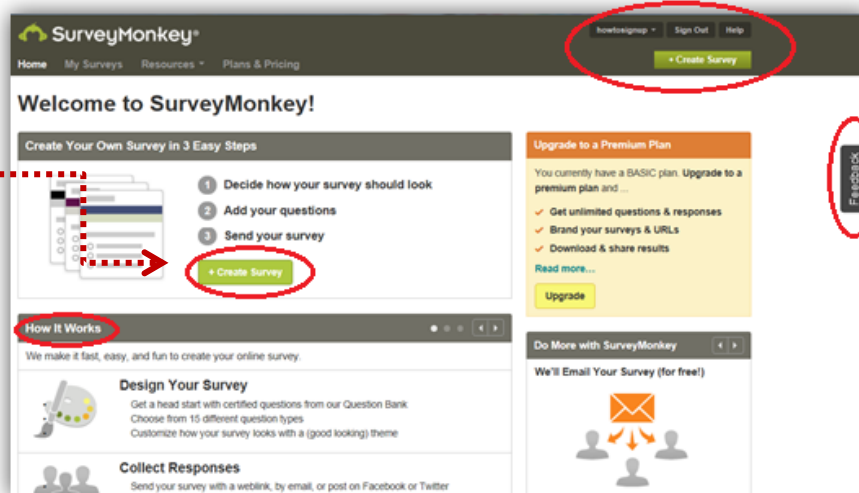
Note: When you click on the links to send you to the “Terms of Use” and the “Privacy Policy” new windows will be opened so the information you have entered will not be affected.
